Sexual Offender Notification

CAMPUS SEX CRIMES PREVENTION ACT

In compliance with regional, state, and federal regulations, University Police Services provides a link to the state of Nevada's Sexual Offender Registry, which tracks all convicted sex offenders in the state, including those enrolled at or employed by educational institutions such as CSN.

The Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act (CSCPA) of 2000 is a federal law that provides for the tracking of convicted sex offenders enrolled at, or employed by, institutions of higher education. The CSCPA is an amendment to the Jacob Wetterling Crimes against Children and Sexually Violent Offender Act.

Under the Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act, persons required to register under a state offender registration program must notify the state concerning each post-secondary school at which the offender works or is a student. The State of Nevada has developed a state wide registry list. The information on the web site refers only to persons who have been convicted of, found guilty of or plead guilty to committing or attempting to commit sexual offenses and may not reflect the entire criminal history of a particular individual.

By law, CSN is required to disclose whether or not Tier 3 sex offenders are present on campus as employees or students at any given time. Currently, there are no Tier 3 offenders registered with the University Police Services.
