Dental Hygiene Bachelor of Science-Completion Program (120 Credits) For Students Seeking Admission to the Summer 2023 Program

The Limited Entry Office will be responsible for managing the application process. The selection of students is performed by an admissions committee. Qualified applicants must:

- Complete a Health Programs Orientation, meet with a Health Programs Advisor, and complete a Limited Entry Workshop (all within 2 years of application deadline)
- Complete an AS (Associate of Science) or AAS (Associate of Applied Science) Degree in Dental Hygiene from an institution accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation.
- Complete a minimum of 89 college credits (30 of which must be transferable lower division General Education courses which satisfy CSN's graduation requirements for a BS degree).
- Meet with Program Director by December 16, 2022. Contact Missy Abel: Missy.Abel@csn.edu.
- General Education credits will need to satisfy prerequisites of ENG 333 and EPY 303.
 - ENG 100 or ENG 101 or ENG 101H or ENG 110 or ENG 113 with a grade of C or better satisfy the prerequisite for ENG 333
 - o PSY 101 or SOC 101 or ANTH 101 satisfy the prerequisite for EPY 303
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 for dental hygiene coursework.
- Complete the U.S. and Nevada Constitution requirement.
- Complete a Limited Entry Workshop.

**Applicants to the BSDH degree completion program who have earned an AS in Dental Hygiene transferable degree will have satisfied all lower division general education requirements. Applicants who have earned a transferable AAS degree in Dental Hygiene may not have satisfied all the lower division general education degree requirements and must do so to graduate from this program. Applicants who have earned all other associates degrees must obtain a CSN transfer evaluation of all college coursework, submit the report with their application to the BSDH program, and meet with a Health Programs Advisor to evaluate any missing lower division general education course requirements. All degree completion applicants must submit an upper division special program course waiver for dental hygiene coursework earned in the associate degree and verification of a current license to practice dental hygiene in a U.S. state or Canadian province.

Applicants will be ranked and selected using a point system through which points will be awarded (Please see selection criteria on BSDH website).
