Dispensing opticians may work in independent practices, corporate practices, hospital clinics, open their own practice, or as outside sales representative. Dispensing opticians will fill a doctor's prescription for eyeglasses and low vision aids. Responsibilities include fitting eyewear, manufacturing eyewear, repairing eyewear, and dispensing eyewear. Ophthalmic Dispensers must have computer skills, communication skills, and an understanding of medical-legal implications. The job market for technicians is good with many jobs available on various shifts in private practices, corporate entities and hospitals.

This program is for individuals who are enrolled as Ophthalmic Dispensing Apprentices, with the Nevada State Board of Dispensing Opticians. In addition to completing this course, apprentices must take and pass the ABO examination, and complete the number of apprenticeship hours as dictated by the state board. This Certificate of Completion program is an open entry program, therefore a "Limited Entry Application for Admission to a Health Science Program "is **not** required. Students are required to take 6 courses consisting of 26 total credits. Courses include lecture, laboratory, and clinical practicum. Students successfully completing this course may take a national certifying exam.
