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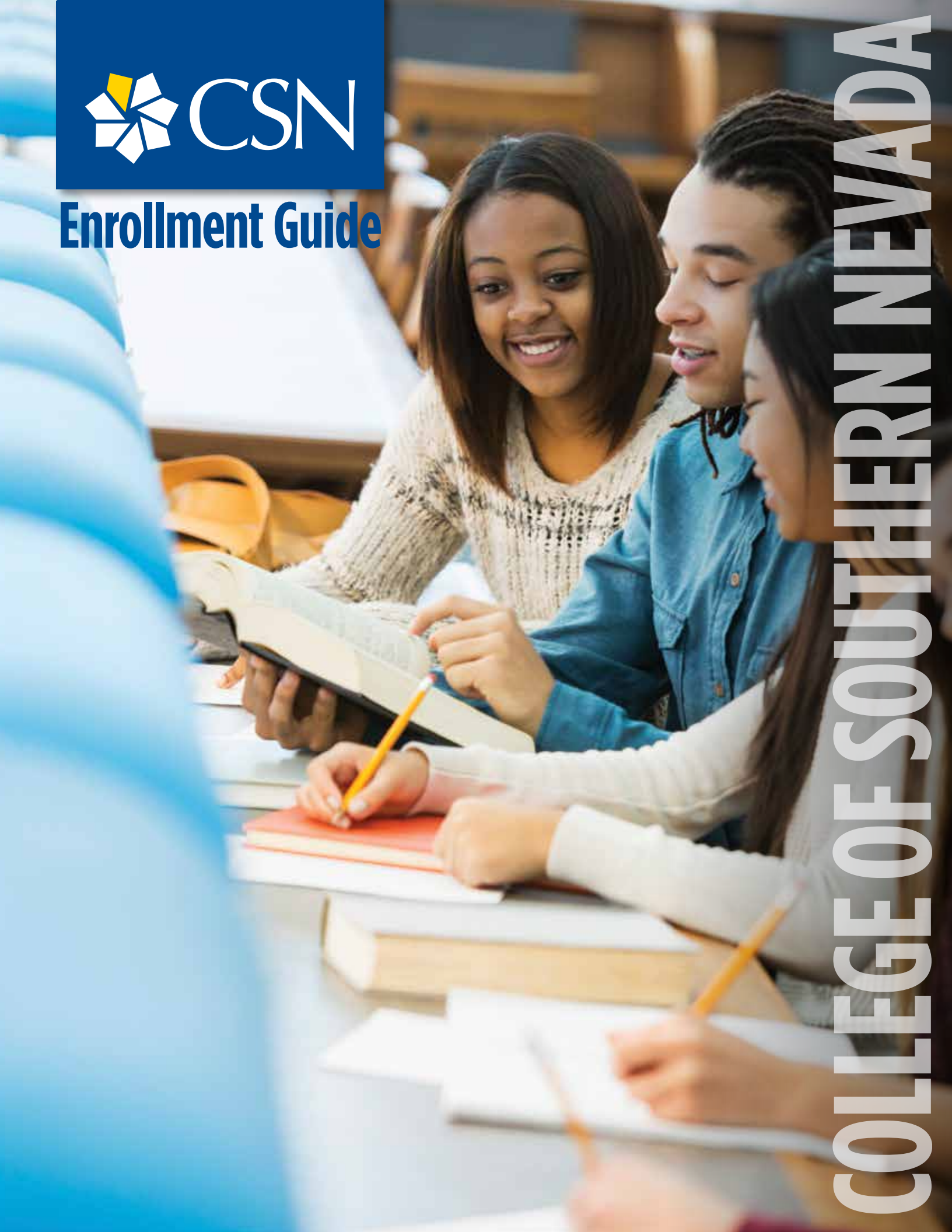

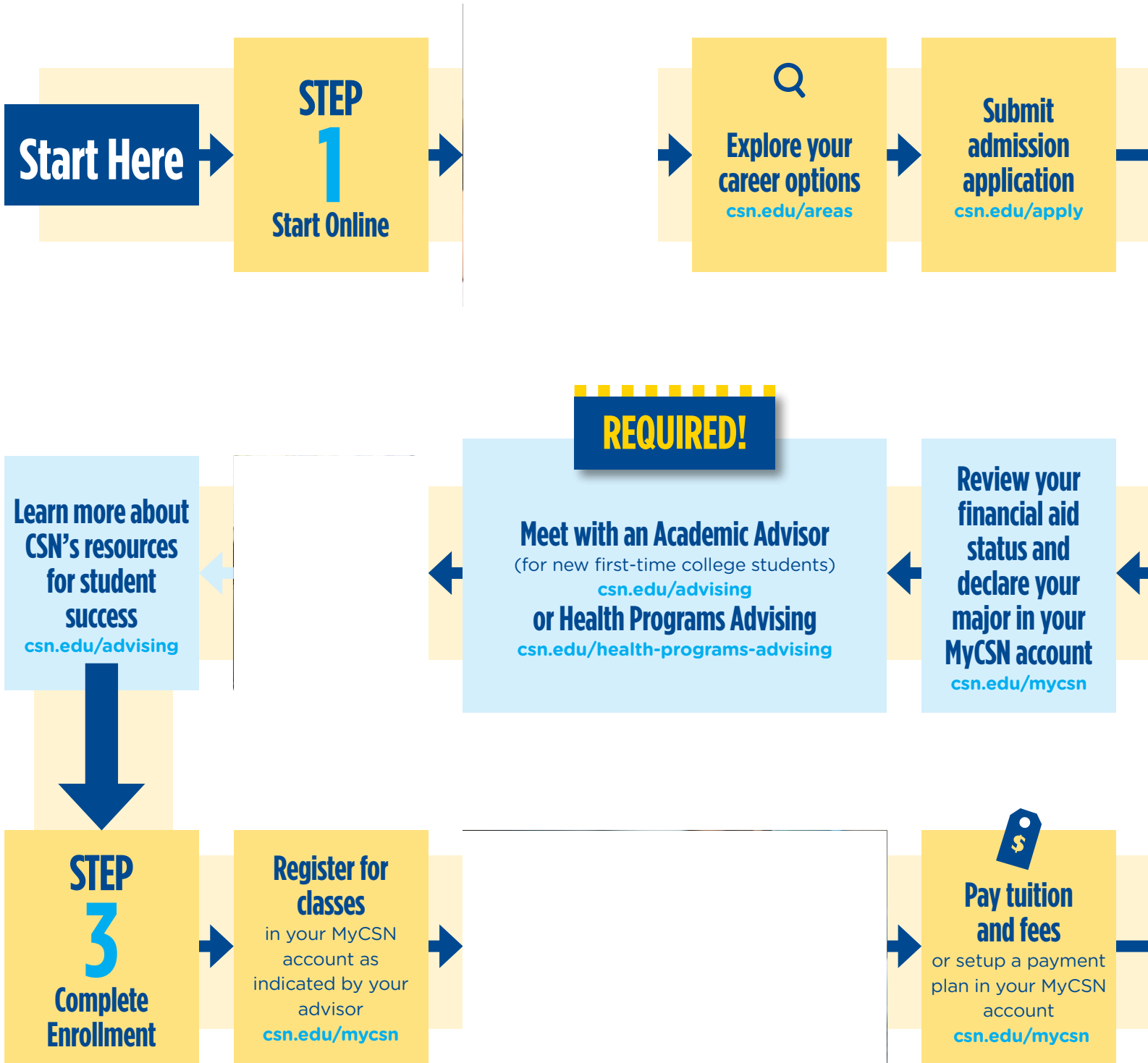

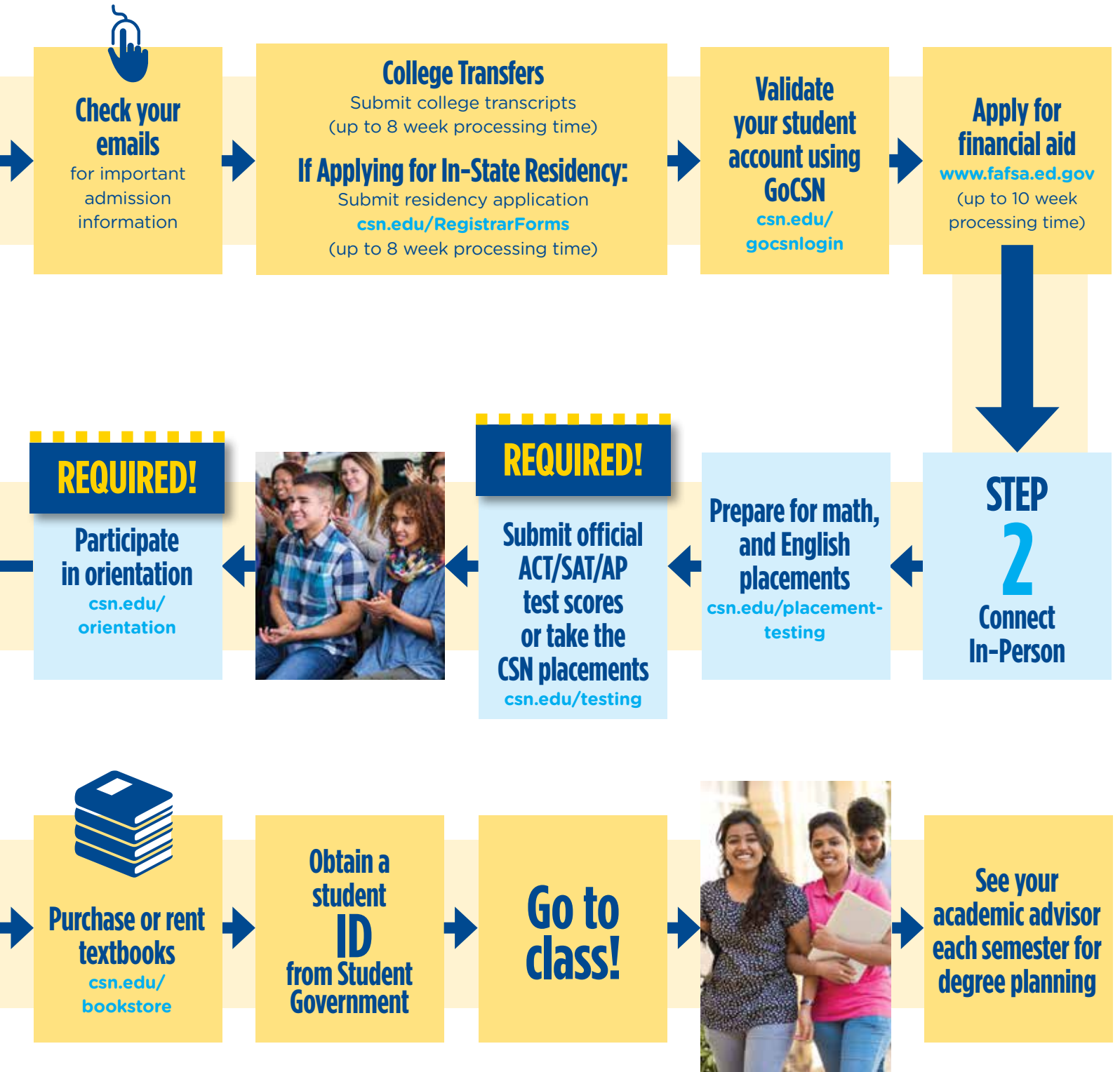

Students planning on transferring outside of the Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE) are advised to select courses that meet the requirements of the institution to which they intend to transfer.





Placement may occur in one of three ways:

1. Take the CSN math, reading and English Accuplacer.

- Results are valid for two years
- CSN does not accept placement scores from other institutions

2. Use ACT or SAT scores:

- Only if scores are less than two years old.
- If results meet minimum requirements determined by CSN.
- Provide official score reports and/or sealed high school transcripts (Internet copies are not accepted).
- Request your high school to fax your transcript to **702-651-7903**.
- Scores can also be viewed online at any testing center by using your College Board or ACT username and password.

3. Submit college-level math and English work for evaluation by CSN's Office of the Registrar:

- "C" or higher grade in transferred course equivalent to or higher than CSN's ENG 100 and Math 095. Request official, sealed transcripts from your previous institution(s) to go to CSN's Office of the Registrar and submit a completed Transfer Credit Evaluation Form available at [csn.edu/registrarforms](https://www.csn.edu/registrarforms)
- Official CLEP exam scores
- Official AP scores

Before taking the CSN Accuplacer exam:

1. Complete the CSN Admissions Application at [csn.edu/apply](https://www.csn.edu/apply).

You will need your NSHE ID number to test!

2. REVIEW! REVIEW! REVIEW! The single most common mistake made by students is neglecting to prepare for the placement test.

Test scores determine how many math and English courses you will take before graduating or transferring from CSN. Scoring your best is very important! For practice tests and review materials go to [csn.edu/placement-testing](https://www.csn.edu/placement-testing).

3. Placement tests are done as walk ins.

Students must sign in to the Coyote Q system by visiting [csn.edu/coyoteq](https://www.csn.edu/coyoteq).



Exam Information

- 1. For the Accuplacer-WritePlacer English Placement, examinees are asked to provide a writing sample into an on-screen text box in response to a randomly chosen topic within the system.** The test is untimed, electronically scored and results are available immediately in most cases. Average testing time is one hour.
- 2. The Math Accuplacer Placement, also untimed, consists of elementary algebra, arithmetic, and college mathematics tests.** The system is adaptive and automatically determines which questions are presented to each student based on individual responses to prior questions. Students will take the college mathematics test only if they score well in the elementary algebra and arithmetic tests. Results are immediate. Average testing time is one-hour.
- 3. The Reading Placement consists of reading prompts and questions that pertain to those prompts.** Average testing time is 30 minutes.

Q&A

Q: When should I complete the CSN Accuplacer Exam?

A: Before meeting with an advisor or counselor and prior to registering for classes. Remember, the earlier in the term you register, the better the selection of classes.

Q: What should I bring the day of the placements?

A: A picture ID and your 10-digit NSHE Student Number.

Q: How much does it cost to take the Accuplacer exams?

A: FREE for CSN students who are enrolling at CSN. There is a \$40 fee to send results to another institution.

Q: When are scores available?

A: Immediately upon completion, except for a few instances when English test results may take up to 72 hours for additional review.

Q: How can I retake placements?

A: Each placement test can only be taken twice in a six month period and you must wait a minimum of two weeks between attempts.

Q: Where can I take the Accuplacer?

A: At any main campus Testing Center. Those residing outside of Las Vegas may call **702-651-7465** or **702-651-5733** for more information.

Description of Degrees

CSN offers over 180 degree and certificate options in more than 70 academic programs. Here are the major differences among our degrees and certificates:

Transferable Degrees

Three types of programs, the **Associate of Arts (AA)**, the **Associate of Science (AS)**, and the **Associate of Business (AB)** degrees are all intended to prepare students for four-year institution transfers with the first half, or two years, of a bachelor's degree program completed. These three Associate Degrees comprise anywhere from 60 to 65 credits split between lower division general education requirements and at least 35 credits of special program requirements. In addition to providing transfer coursework towards the initial two years of study in four-year colleges and universities, these associate degrees also prepare students to enter the workforce with specific career skills.

Associate of Arts Degree (AA)

A general transfer and college degree allowing for a disciplinary emphasis in numerous fields that can lead to further specialized study at a four-year college or university.

Associate of Business Degree (AB)

A general transfer and college degree stressing basic business operations and skills required for employment in business related careers.

Associate of Science Degree (AS)

A general transfer and college degree designed for students who are planning to transfer to a four-year college or university.

Non-Transferable Degrees

Associate of Applied Science Degree (AAS)*

A 60-80 credit degree designed to prepare students for entry into particular occupations. Unlike Certificates of Achievement, the AAS incorporates additional analytical, science and human relations components that better prepare the student to meet challenges common in the workplace.

Associate of General Studies (AGS)

For students who do not wish to concentrate on any one field and seek to learn about a variety of academic disciplines or occupational programs. While some courses may transfer, the AGS is not intended as a transfer degree. Interested students must consult with an Advisor/Success Coach to plan a course of study.

Certificate of Achievement (CA)

An industry-driven 30 to 45 credit program designed to provide intensive training in specific occupational areas. Currently CSN offers CAs in more than 50 different fields.

Skills Certificates (SC)

There are over 30 different industry-driven certification options recognizing identified core competencies and issued by an academic department upon completion of a defined set of courses, including:

Bachelor of Science (BS) & Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS)

CSN offers four-year programs for specific occupations such as Cardiorespiratory Sciences, Dental Hygiene, Deaf Studies, Nursing, Fire & Emergency Services Administration, Project Management and Medical Laboratory Scientist ranging from 120 - 123 credits. Academic Scholarships for New Students

Students completing and submitting this single application will be considered for all in-house scholarships for which they are eligible. All students are strongly encouraged to apply.

Please note:

- Scholarship applications are accepted from January through June for the following academic year. Specific application dates for each academic year are posted on the CSN website at [csn.edu/scholarships](https://www.csn.edu/scholarships).
- Successful applicants are notified during June and July.
- Additional scholarship funds may become available during an academic year from new donors or additional donations from existing donors. Recipients are notified as funds become available.
- All students seeking CSN scholarships are encouraged to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) www.fafsa.ed.gov to allow for a review of eligibility for other funds.
- Silver State Opportunity Grant Program eligibility requirements:
 - Declare a major
 - Enroll in 15 credits
 - Place into college-level mathematics & English
 - Be a Nevada resident
 - Complete a FAFSA
 - Meet institutional Title IV financial aid satisfactory academic progress requirements

MAKING COLLEGE ACCESSIBLE & AFFORDABLE

The Nevada Promise Scholarship helps high school seniors pay for up to three years of tuition and mandatory fees at CSN.

Financial Aid Checklist

2. Financial assistance may be combined in an 'Award Package' in the form of:

- **Grants** - Funds based on financial need that do not need to be repaid.
- **Scholarships** - Non-repayable awards based on merit or merit plus need.
- **Work Study** - Part-time employment on campus for students with financial need.
- **Loans** - Borrowed money that must be paid back with interest after graduation or if the student drops out of college before degree completion.

3. Monitor the FAFSA process in your MyCSN Communications Center and TO DO list (csn.edu/MyCSN) for notifications from the Financial Aid Department.

- Declare a major and submit your high school transcript.
- Check processing needs and select appropriate forms as indicated in your TO DO list.
- Verification forms can be accessed through the Financial Aid Department website at csn.edu/financialaid. Make sure to select the Forms link pertaining to the year of your application.
- IRS Tax Transcripts can be obtained through the IRS website by creating an account online at irs.gov/Individuals/Get-Transcript or call **1-800-908-9946**.

4. You must ACCEPT your award package in your MyCSN Student Center under the Financial Aid subhead link named Accept/Decline Awards.

5. If accepting federal student loans, you must:

- Be enrolled in six financial aid fundable credits each semester (Math Prep does not count).
- Complete an Entrance Loan Counseling session at www.studentloans.gov.
- Complete a Master Promissory Note (MPN) at www.studentloans.gov.
- Meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards.

6. Enroll in the appropriate semester/term courses.

- Enrollment for the entire semester (including late starting classes) must be completed prior to the financial aid census date.
- The census date is published in your MyCSN Communications Center and on the Semester Calendar.

7. Check the Financial Aid Department website for disbursement dates at csn.edu/financialaid.

8. Be aware of payment due dates in case of issues that could impact the disbursement of your financial aid, including verifications and/or holds.

- You are responsible for making payment arrangements with the Cashier's Office.
- Payment plans are available if you are taking six credits or more. Sign into MyCSN, enter your Student Center, and locate the drop down menu in the Finances section labeled Other Financial. Follow the prompts.

9. Financial aid Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requires students to meet the following three (3) stipulations in order to continue receiving aid:

- Pass 67% of all attempted credits
- Maintain a minimum of a 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Complete the program of study within a 150% maximum time frame by not exceeding 150% of the program's length (i.e., a 60-credit associate degree program must be completed before reaching 90 credits, including developmental, ESL and failed/repeated courses).
